SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversee the day-to-day operation of the SWIM system
- Liaise with SWIM users (Queensland councils / Water Service Providers (WSPs)) regarding their use of SWIM, including providing assistance with using SWIM
- Liaise with data receivers, such as Department of Environment and Resources, Dept of Infrastructure and Planning, Bureau of Meteorology, National Water Commission
- Develop and maintain a good technical understanding of the SWIM water reporting system, in terms
 of both the reporting content and the information technology
- Develop technical information to support the maintenance and development of the SWIM system, including providing technical support to external IT consultants
- Monitor (and report to SWIM Project Manager) the use of SWIM by users, including:
 - o compliance with mandatory reporting requirements (to an acceptable level)
 - o participation of all types of reporting by all Qld WSPs
- Assist with formal SWIM user training programs

- Undertake, or assist, with a range of communication activities regarding the SWIM project
- Assess the quality of data submitted and the effectiveness of SWIM quality assurance tools
- Other SWIM-related or *qldwater* activities as required by the SWIM project Manager or *qldwater* CEO
- Participation in the development of SWIMLocal, a distributed software platform to help water service
 providers integrate their disparate data gathering and storage systems, and other new projects as
 identified.
